COUNCIL 9487 SPEND DOWN ACCOUNT - EXPLAINED

Brothers, last month I wrote an article about living the principle of charity as it pertains to my experiences. This month my writing is also focused on our principle of charity but this time I am writing about our spend down account.

It occurred to me at the last monthly business meeting that our Brother, Ricardo Teano, has done such an outstanding job in recruiting new Knights for our council, that 20% or more of our membership have joined our council since our spend down policy was established. Therefore, most of these newer members probably do not know the history of our spend-down account and policy. Our current officers agreed that it would be worthwhile to write a brief summa-

ry of our spend down account so that all of our membership would have an understanding of the spend down account.

In 2020 during PGK Ken Breneman's term as Grand Knight a committee headed by PGKs John Teeter and Dave Atkins was established to look at the funds our council had sitting in various accounts, determine an acceptable reserve fund amount and establish a plan to spend the funds over the reserve amount in a way that was in alignment with The KofC principle of charity. Long time members of our council were invited to participate in the committee.

In the early years of our council there was a goal to someday have our own KoC hall. Funds raised through various council activities were being saved for the purpose of building a hall. At the time our parish had more undeveloped land than we presently have so it was a goal to build a KofC hall on some of this land. After our parish sold the undeveloped land to the group that built the Lake Forest Nursing Center our council realized that it was very unlikely that our council could ever afford to purchase land and pay for the construction of a hall in the Lake Forest area. Additionally, the amount of money our council was holding in reserve was deemed to be excessive, and in fact a possible violation of IRS rules for 501c Organizations. The IRS recommendation is that a small 501 keep approximately 3 months of cash flow in reserve, while Supreme recommends a balance of \$10,000 or less. This is deemed to be adequate to cover costs and donations of a typical Council. Our council, however, is not typical because our membership is over three times the average council membership.

The committee recommended that the funds exceeding \$30,000 should be spent on charitable causes that were in alignment with the principles of The KoC. Twenty percent of the funds put in the spend down account were to be spent each Columbian year until the fund was depleted. It is the responsibility of the Grand Knight to identify where the funds would be spent and authorize the donation of the funds. To date our council has donated funds towards the purchase of an ultrasound machine, donated to the KofC coats for kids funds, and purchased gifts and gift cards for 10 families through Catholic Charities of Orange County.

The current balance of the spend down account is 29,817.20 and as previously stated each year our Grand Knight will authorize a charitable donation of approximately 20% of the original balance, to a worthy cause until the fund is depleted. This donation is in addition to the budgeted donations our chapter makes during the course of a columbian year.

Though the goal of having our own KofC hall is no longer feasible, our council is donating these funds to worthy causes and living true to the Knights of Columbus principle of charity.

I pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America and to the Republic for which it stands, one nation <u>under God</u>, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all.

How the words "UNDER GOD" came to be added to the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag

The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States originated on Columbus Day, 1893. It contained no reference to Almighty God, until in New York City on April 22, 1951, the Board of Directors of the Knights of Columbus adopted a resolution to amend the Pledge of Allegiance as recited at the opening of each of the meetings of the 800 Fourth Degree Assemblies of the Knights of Columbus by the addition of the words "under God" after the words "one nation". The adoption of this resolve by the Supreme Board of Directors had the effect of an immediate initiation of this practice throughout the aforesaid Fourth Degree Assembly meetings.

At their annual State Meetings, held in April and May of 1952, the State Councils of Florida, South Dakota, New York and Michigan adopted resolutions recommending that the Pledge of Allegiance be so amended and that Congress be petitioned to have such amendment made effective.

On August 21, 1952, the Supreme Council of the Knights of Columbus, at its annual meeting, adopted a resolution urging that the change be made general and copies of this resolution were sent to the President, the Vice President (as Presiding Officer of the Senate) and the Speaker of the House of Representatives. The National Fraternal Congress meeting in Boston on September 24, 1952, adopted a similar resolution upon the recommendation of its President, Supreme Knight Luke E. Hart. Several State Fraternal Congresses acted likewise almost Immediately thereafter.

At its annual meeting the following year, on August 20, 1953, the Supreme Council of the Knights of Columbus repeated its resolution to make this amendment to the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag general and to send copies of this resolve to the President, Vice President, Speaker of the House, and to each member of both Houses of Congress. From this latter action, many favorable replies were received, and a total of seventeen resolutions were introduced in the House of Representatives to so amend the Pledge of Allegiance as set forth in the Public Law relating to the use of the flag. The resolution introduced by Congressman Louis C. Rabaut of Michigan was adopted by both Houses of Congress, and it was signed by President Eisenhower on Flag Day. June 14, 1954, thereby making official the amendment conceived, sponsored, and put into practice by the Knights of Columbus more than three years before.

In a message to Supreme Knight Luke E. Hart at the meeting of the Supreme Council in Louisville, August 17, 1954, President Eisenhower, in recognition of the initiative of the Knights of Columbus in originating and sponsoring the amendment to the Pledge of Allegiance, said:

"We are particularly thankful to you for your part in the movement to have the words 'under God' added to our Pledge of Allegiance. These words will remind Americans that despite our great physical strength we must remain humble. They will help us to keep constantly in our minds and hearts the spiritual and moral principles which alone give dignity to man, and upon which our way of life is founded. For the contribution which your organization has made to this cause, we must be genuinely grateful."

In August, 1954, the Illinois American Legion Convention adopted a resolution whereby recognition was given to the Knights of Columbus as having initiated, sponsored and brought about the amendment to the Pledge of Allegiance; and on October 6, 1954, the National Executive Committee of the American Legion gave its approval to that resolution.
