Like Peter, the Apostle, Ricardo Sr said, "I denied them 3 times." Eventually one Sunday morning he said yes.

He pursued it and became a retreat table leader and worked with next retreat formation. He transferred his knight membership to Council 9487. Right away, he saw love and brotherhood. When men go through trash to recycle, sell donuts, burritos, dinners, and build beds among other things, he knew he wanted to be part of it. He began to search and find ways to help. Ricardo Jr was helping with the church silent auction, so he began to help him as well. Ricardo Sr was invited by a brother knight to the Garden of Innocence Burial. Little did he know that God had a different plan for him. On behalf of the Council, he gave a speech for the children and was given the privilege to put one of the little angels to rest "Baby Don". A life-changing experience.

GENERAL BUSINESS MEETING PROTOCOL

Brothers, thank you to the brothers who attend our monthly business meetings. Your participation helps our council to be a strong and vibrant council. About 15% of our membership regularly attend the monthly business meetings. For those unaware of our schedule, on the first Wednesday of each month, our council has a business meeting in the parish hall starting at 7:20pm with the saying of a decade of the rosary. The meeting usually ends around 8:45 pm.

Our Worthy Grand Knight asked that I dedicate a column to the proper protocols to be followed at a meeting since our council continues to grow and many members may not be aware of our meeting protocols, which are set in place by the Knights of Columbus charter constitution.

Meetings are conducted according to Robert's Rules of Order. When the Grand Knight pounds the gavel 3 times on the podium or table all members are to rise and be silent. The Grand Knight will make an announcement. When the GK pounds the gavel again the attendees may be seated but again remain silent.

When prayers are being said and during the pledge of allegiance all hats are to be taken off.

The following is from the Knights of Columbus manual:

When a dignitary attends a meeting the charter states:

"When priests, state officers, vice supreme masters, district masters, district deputies, general agents, field agents or special guests are present at a meeting they should be treated as dignitaries accorded due recognition for the office or position they hold. They should always be seated in a place of honor. If a dignitary should arrive while a meeting is in progress; the presiding officer raps the gavel three times for all to stand and instructs the warden to escort the guest to the station of the presiding officer. The presiding officer then offers a seat of honor to the guest. With the exception of a priest, a dignitary present at his home council or assembly, need not be specifically recognized unless he has been invited to attend in his official capacity or requests to be so recognized. This will allow the officer to engage in the regular business of his home council or assembly without involving the position he holds. When a general agent or field agent is present at a meeting, he should be treated as a guest. He should be seated and introduced with the dignitaries".
