His wife was a Eucharistic Minister and his children were altar servers, as well as in the children's choir and the children's liturgy program. Brother Jose was inspired by his family's participation in our parish and decided he also wanted to get involved in our parish. Like so many other members of our council, Brother Ricardo Teano was instrumental in recruiting Brother Jose to join our council. Being a Knight has provided Brother Lopez with the opportunity to form many

friendships and give to our parish community. He has been involved with numerous Knight's activities over the years.

For the past few years Brother Jose has mainly focused on two activities: The Blood Drive and the parish VITA program. He oversees the 3 to 4 blood drives our council puts on annually, in conjunction with the American Red Cross. For the 2 weekends before each blood drive, he recruits donors after each Sunday Mass. On the day of the blood drive he works with the red cross team in setting up the parish hall as a donor station, checks in the donors as they show up to donate, answers donor's questions. and does whatever is needed to make the donation process go smoothly. We have been told by the red cross supervisor that of all the Orange County donor stations, SDC is the most organized, smoothest run, and most consistent station. Your efforts are appreciated brother!

For the past two years Brother Jose has also volunteered with our parish VITA program helping parishioners prepare their tax returns free of charge. He feels this has also been a great way for him to give back to our parish community.

Since he retired, but still felt the desire to work, our brother has become a Medicare agent. This has enabled him to help friends, family, neighbors and parishioners who are 65 and older help navigate the complex Medicare system. This is yet another way Jose gives back to others.

As you can see, Brother Jose Lopez is truly deserving of this recognition as our June 2025 Knight of The Month. Thank you, brother, for setting such a good example and living the principles of Faith, Unity, and Fraternity.

THE CURSILLO CHRISTIAN MOVEMENT

BRIEF HISTORY OF THE BEGINNING OF THE CURSILLO MOVEMENT

The Cursillo Movement did not happen by chance. God willed it to be. In 1941, the top council for young people in Catholic Action gathered 100,000 young men who lived in "God's Grace" for a pilgrimage to Santiago de Compostela in Spain. The beginning of the pilgrimage set the tone. It provided a spirit of moving onward. It was s spirit of brotherhood among fellow pilgrims who were striving together to reach the goal of a life fully given for the love of God and man. The pilgrim style had marked much of the spirituality of the Cursillo Movement. Born out of a spirit of renewal in the Church that preceded the Second Vatican Council, the Cursillo Movement originated in Spain in the early 1940's; therefore, many of the terms used in the Cursillo Movement are of Spanish origin. Bishop Juan Hervas of Mallorca, Spain and a dedicated layperson, Eduardo Bonin, were the two primary leaders of the first Curcillos in Christianity. The first Cursillo was held in August 1944 in Mallorca, Spain and its first Rector was Eduardo Bonin. The first Cursillo in the United States took place in Waco, Texas in 1957.

CURSILLO IN CHRISTIANITY

The Cursillo is an encounter with Christ. It is movement of the Catholic Church which, by means of a specific method, makes it possible for people to live what is fundamental for being a Christian. Cursillo helps people discover and fulfill their personal vocations. It promotes the creation of core groups of Christians who leaven their environments with the Gospel.

Cursillo is a Spanish word the means "short course". It begins on Thursday evening and ends Sunday evening. Those attending, Cursillistas, live and work together during those three days listen to talks given by priests, deacons, and laypeople. The talks deal with topics about life, the Christian ideal, the Catholic faith, and a method to bring Christ into the modern world.

CHRISTIANIZING ENVIRONMENTS

The primary objective of the Cursillo Movement is to develop in adult Christians a consciousness of their ability and mission to become leaders of the Christian renewal in their environments. This "Christianizing of Environments" is what the Cursillo Movement is about.
