Fortunate and were present at the St Peter Square when white smoke appeared in the chimney announcing that Pope Leo XIV was chosen as our 267th Pope, and the first American Pope. What a blessing!

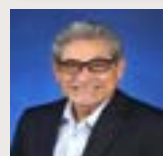

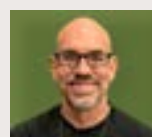
