Our "Saint of the Month" for September is St. Maximilian Kolbe. Born in Poland in 1894 and ordained a priest (Franciscan Friar) in 1918. He took the name "Maria" in honor of Our Lady. Father Maximilian worked as a missionary throughout Asian before WWII, including founding a Franciscan monastery on the outskirts of Nagasaki which survived the atomic bomb. He returned to Poland and was there when his town was captured by the Nazis. He refused to sign the "Deutsche Volksliste", even though he had German ancestry, which would have saved him from his eventual arrest by the Gestapo. He was sent to the dreaded Auschwitz, where he continued his priestly duties and was severely harassed for doing so. When the camp commander ordered ten random prisoners selected to be starved to death for a recent prison break, Father Maximilian was not one of them. However, he volunteered to take the place of a fellow prisoner, a Catholic man with a wife and family, and was martyred in his place. Saint Maximilian Maria Kolbe, pray for us!
