



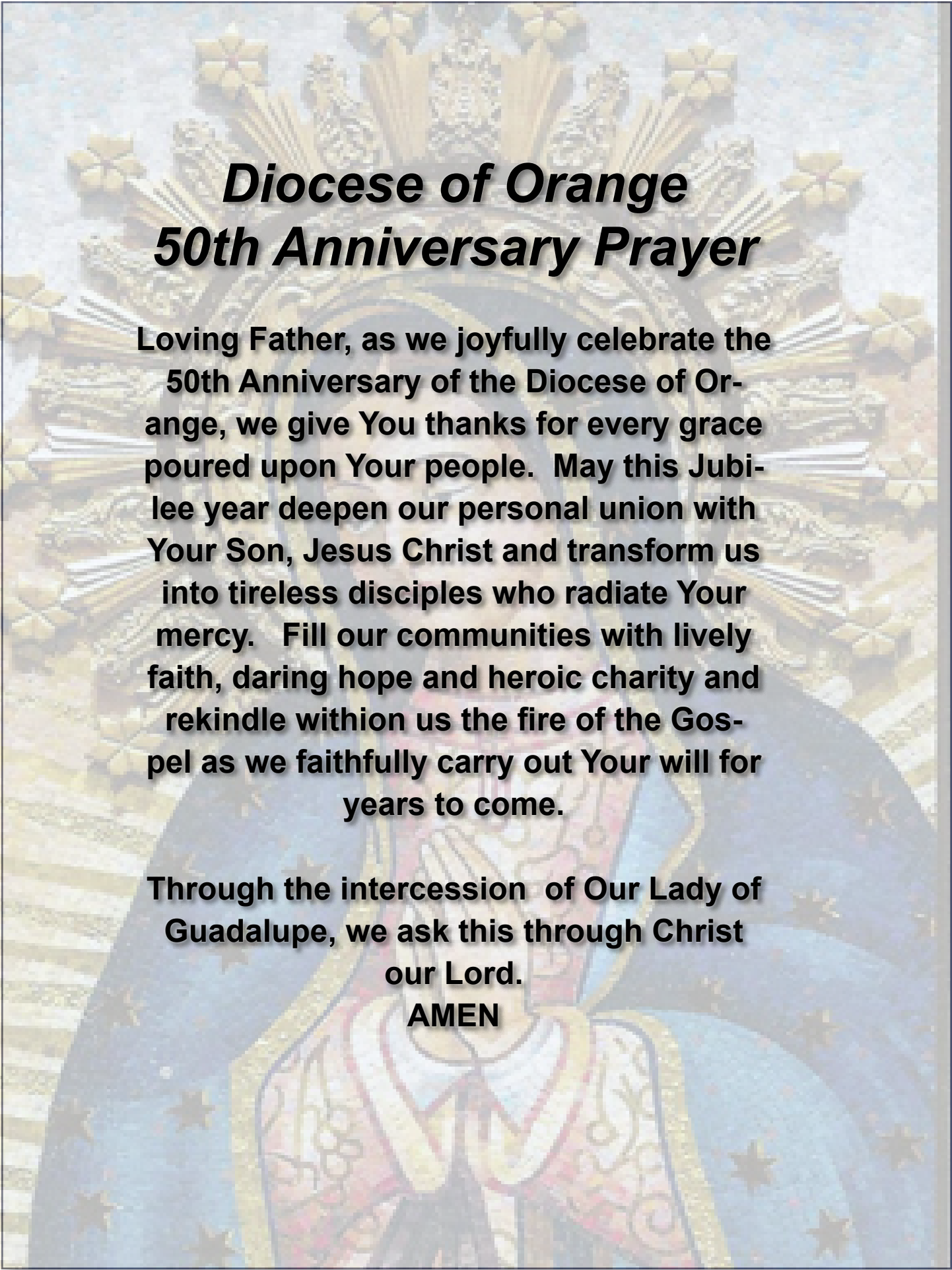

Paraphrased : Not by faith alone but with works

Brothers,

As you all know, we lost our Stewart a few weeks ago. Stewart Imagawa to be exact.

We knew him as Stewart and Stew and sometimes Stewie. Depending on the season, he might be Irish Stew or Christmas Stew or Beef Stew. But now he is gone and there is a huge hole in the heart of our council.

Stewart was involved in 9487 for more than 15 years. He joined the Knights shortly after becoming a Catholic gentleman. He has served as our treasurer for the past several years and was a natural.

Here's some comments from our outgoing Financial Secretary John Blaney:

"Stewart was a friend for more than 20 years. He was a soccer coach for his daughter and my daughter. Also, he reffed with me on the soccer field. He loved doing things with the kids. Once leaving the computer field, he became a substitute teacher doing what he loved most: Being with children. He wanted to become Catholic of which I was his sponsor. At the same time, he wanted to become a knight and became part of the Mag Seven. At this time because of this group, he became a fourth-degree knight.

Stewart became sick with cancer at least two years ago telling nobody. He was that type of person. Once when we had to see a tax person he joined me, again not stating he was sick. The very next day, he was carted off the hospital in a lot of pain. Sorry to say it was the start of the finish. The man ran a great race. A race that that nobody could ever do.

The man never complained and to the very end worked with me on the financial part of this council day in and day out. He loved each and every knight working his magic. We can not replace a person of his stature. We had a motto that once a bill came in to get it paid ASAP. Please pray for Stewart so that he will look over all of us and help this council thrive the way he wanted it to. God bless you Stewart and you will never be forgotten."

And from Brother Patrick Bole:

"I know you are familiar with my disdain for the historical ineptness of the expense reimbursement protocol of this council (ie: Dave being owed \$3000+ for greater than 8 weeks AFTER he turned in the expense receipts for 1 of the earlier golf dinners) .

When Stewart became Treasurer, the "Red Sea parted" and "business as usual "was a thing of the past."

I turned in receipts once for \$700+ and was somewhat surprised that a whole seven calendar days went by without hearing (via a reimbursement check) from Stewart . It turns out that Stewart had gone out of town that week.

I ran into him after a Sunday 0830 Mass and asked if he had seen the receipts. He did not answer me directly. He just took my phone and gave it back to me: 60 seconds. He had deposited the money into my bank electronically while I stood there!

Was it a big deal - not really. It just showed that Stewart was serious about his job, his friends and his fellow Knights.

He embodied everything we want to believe about ourselves by what he did for us and this parish, every day."

From Grand Knight Mark Angel:

"A few years ago, I was tasked with writing an article for the newsletter about the origins of our spend down account and why we have it and what was to be done with this account. I knew nothing about the history of the spend down account. After the meeting where I received this assignment Brother Stewart came up to me and told me the whole history as he knew it including why there was a lot of emotional feelings on the topic of the spend down account. He took it up on himself to help me and was so generous with his knowledge and time. No one asked him to do this, I think he sensed my ignorance and just wanted to help me."

From past Grand Knight Dave Atkins:

"One thing that stands out for me regarding Stewart was that he was always there for his friends, especially the Mag 7 team. If we needed something, he was there. He was always available for the Camino and festival each year. If I needed help with setup of the registration area or setting out all the signage for the festival, he was there for me. And regarding the golf dinner fundraiser, later called the Party on the Pavilion, Stewart was a master at cooking chicken!! Quite the BBQ chicken whisperer he was

He also helped in other ways as well. I can remember Stewart helping Conner with his Boy Scout

Eagle project. It was called Boys Town, up past Rose's Cantina, and Stewart was the last adult to leave. He was so committed to helping my son finish the project and become that Eagle Scout in 2011. He also loved to dabble in fire. He would assist for many years with the Easter Vigil bonfire. We would set up at 7 pm and he wanted to start the fire 40 minutes early!! And he and France would come to my house for Halloween and oversee the bonfire we had in the middle of the street. He was a closet pyromaniac for sure!!

Some of my fondest memories of Stewart were from recycling days. He and I would work together at the paper recycling area. We would work there all morning, sorting paper, but talking about everything at the same time. Then we would clean up and start cooking hamburgers for the crew. Again, Stewart was always one of the last men to leave, making sure everything was cleaned and stored away.

I will remember Stewart as a close friend, one who was always there for others."

There you have it. Stewart in a nutshell: friend, hard-worker, devoted Catholic, competent treasurer. He embodied what it was to be a knight and will serve as a shining example for all of us for years to come. We will miss you, my friend.

Looking for 2026 Weekly Recycling Team Members

The recycling area is known as the Barn so we call the weekly recycling teams 'Barn Duty'. We create 3-4 person teams and assign the same week each month to the team so they can handle any recyclables left in the dropoff area from Monday to Sunday putting in around 3-4 hrs of volunteer hours on their assigned week. You will be trained and have your own key so you can recycle on your own schedule after you coordinate with your team members. You do not need to be retired. A number of our current volunteers are working full time jobs so we recycle before or after work and on the weekends, once again only 1 week per month for a few hours. The Barn Duty teams handle about 50% of the recyclables dropped off so they are an important part of the Recycling program. Father McGivney, Founder

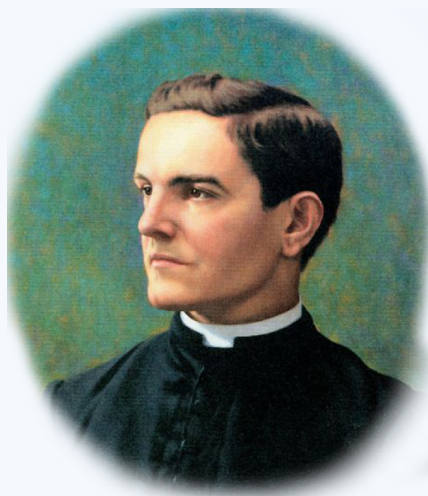
If the strength of an organization can be judged by its founder, it is no surprise that the Knights of Columbus continues to grow in numbers and good works as it celebrates 144 years next week. Father McGivney laid a strong yet supple foundation, appropriate for its day yet open to change and challenges.

We need only to consider the words of those who knew him to discover his unique character. He was known for his orderliness and attention to detail as seminary sacristan, yet fellow students remembered best his sense of humor and easy laugh. His rector called him “exceedingly sensitive *usque ad lacrimas*” (“even unto tears”), yet as a priest, Father McGivney stood bravely at the gallows, reciting the prayers of the Church for a young murderer he had brought back to the faith. In a eulogy, a Knight said, “He was a man of the people,” zealous for the betterment of both their earthly condition and immortal souls.

As we observe the day the Connecticut legislature approved the charter of the Order – March 29, 1882 – let us ask Blessed Michael McGivney to continue to build up his Knights in charity, unity and fraternity.
